Alton is a warm and welcoming vibrant north Hampshire town which truly has community spirit at its heart. Situated at the source of the River Wey and enjoying a rural backdrop at the gateway to the South Downs National Park, Alton is known by many as "Jane Austen Country" with its close ties to its charming neighbouring parish of Chawton - home to Jane Austen's House Museum and Chawton Library. The largest settlement in East Hampshire, the town also has its own heritage attraction - the Mid Hants Railway Watercress Line – as well as being well known for the civil war Battle of Alton in 1643, the murder of Fanny Adams in 1867 and also home to the Allen Gallery and Curtis Museum.

Staying within the town, visitors will find a variety of shops from national chain stores to local independent retailers. When it comes to dining out and socialising, Alton offers a wide choice of cafes, restaurants, bars and quintessentially English pubs to choose from, all located within easy walking distance of the town centre.

With plenty to see and do in and around Alton, the town serves as a convenient base to explore the local area. With so many villages within a few miles of Alton, visitors can take in the breathtaking views and the rich heritage of the region, and also sample the diverse range of locally produced food and drink — which can also be experienced at the Alton Farmers' Market every second Saturday of the month in the High Street.

HISTORY OF ALTON

Alton is an historic Hampshire town at the entrance to the South Downs National Park.

Alton is steeped with a fascinating history, from the bloody Battle of Alton in the English Civil War to the literary genius of Jane Austen. With its rich heritage dating from Roman times to its association with Fanny Adams, Alton is an intriguing place to visit.

From the 13th to the 15th century Alton was a very prosperous community, mainly from weaving and the production of garments. There were a number of textile merchants situated in the town centre.

From the 18th century onward the town was well known for its manufacturing, being famous for paper making – and since 1763 for brewing (the main production site in the centre of town closing in 2015).

One of the most notable buildings is St Lawrence Church dating from the Norman Tower built in 1070, and where the main Battle of Alton took place in December 1643 between the Parliamentary and Royal Forces. Colonel Bolle, the Commander of the Royalist Forces, is understood to have been killed in the church pulpit. Bullet holes in the main church doors and stone pillars can be seen. The church also has a Norman font hewn from one piece of stone.

Near St Lawrence Church is the site of the Norman ecclesiastical headquarters. The Quakers have been instrumental in developing Alton over the years and near the Church there is 'The Friends Meeting House' built in 1672, which is the second oldest meeting house in use in the world.



Other interesting buildings include the Victorian Assembly Rooms, with the Curtis Museum and Inwood Court all in the same close. The roof spaces of all three buildings were designed by the architect Charles Barry in 1870. The war memorial known as The Cairn was erected in 1920 and contains 30 tonnes of Cornish granite.

Alton was the scene of one of the most notable Victorian tragedies – the murder of Fanny Adams in 1867. She was brutally killed by a solicitor's clerk, Frederick Baker, near Flood Meadows and her grave is in Alton Cemetery. From this event, the expression "Sweet FA" came about.

The Swan Hotel in the High Street was first mentioned in the archives in 1499 and was the stopping place for stagecoaches travelling daily from London to Winchester and Southampton. The oldest house in Alton is numbers 8 and 10 Turk Street dating from the 14th century and is still inhabited.

Several famous people have lived in Alton and the surrounding area including Jane Austen, Gilbert White, Elizabeth Gaskell, and Cardinal Newman. There are several blue heritage plaques located on buildings in Alton including the former homes of the famous folklorists Peter and Iona Opie, the botanist William Curtis, and the site of Jane Austen's brother's bank.

SHOPPING IN ALTON

Alton offers a delightful mix of High Street branded stores and quirky unique independent shops.

The town centre offers several well-known household brand names which sit alongside a number of unique boutique shops selling objets d'art, jewellery, rare books, vintage and designer clothes, decorative pieces, crafts and paintings.

Despite the recent pandemic Alton has seen a flurry of new independent start-up businesses pop up in the town centre. Including the 'Alton Creatives Emporium' located in the Market Square where a collective of local artists and crafters showcase their wares and hold a regular series of creative workshops.

Another popular new addition is the eco-friendly 'Alton Fill-Up' zero waste store in the High Street. Where you can refill your own containers with household essentials including store cupboard ingredients and household products.

Others new to the High Street are 'Ritual' beauty spa, 'Heavens Kitchen', 'Carpino's Pizza' and 'Bean and Bake' sandwich shop. With 'Hun' hair and beauty in Market Street, 'Acorns' mobile café pod in the Public Gardens and 'Sugarloaf Coffee House' at Energique in Anstey Park.

In Westbrook Walk, the pedestrianised shopping walkway, has also seen several additions including a new range of home themed stores with Westbrook Interiors, Westbrook Kitchens and Mr & Mrs Bathrooms. As well as 'Blend-it', a healthy food and juice bar with a wellness centre upstairs, and the 'Alton Community Cupboard' giving away surplus food.

Alton was historically known as a market town and today 'Southern Market Traders' still run weekly Tuesday markets in the High Street with the popular 'Hampshire Farmers Markets' and 'Alton Lions Craft Markets' on the second Saturday of each month.







The Town Council organises regular themed market events over the summer months in the Public Gardens and Christmas Markets in the Town Centre.

Alton has a range of supermarkets in the town centre including Sainsbury's, Marks and Spencer Food and Iceland - for those who enjoy local produce 'Joyce and Lucas' butchers can be found in the High Street. Slightly out of the town centre you will find Waitrose next to the train station, with Aldi, Pets at Home and Wickes on the Alton Retail Park on Mill Lane.

Alton promotes car free travel and has lots of cycle parking around the town centre which can be found on the Cycle Alton map – www.myjourney hampshire.com/cycle/active-alton.

There are also lots of bus stops in the High Street connecting Alton with the surrounding towns and villages. Stagecoach is the main provider in the area, with bus timetables, journey planner and information available from – tel: 0871 200 2233, website: www.stagecoachbus.com

If you are travelling by car there are plenty of free short stay parking spaces along the High Street, Market Street and Turk Street.

Longer stay pay and display parking is available in

several well positioned car parks with good accessibility to the town centre.

RECREATION

Alton has a wide variety of natural open spaces alongside formal gardens and modern sporting facilities.

There is over 150 acres of public open The regal looking bandstand was commissioned in 2012 by Alton Town Council to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II. Replacing the original wooden bandstand which had been built in 1935 to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of King George V.

spaces to enjoy in Alton including Anstey Park, Jubilee Playing Fields, King's Pond, The Public Gardens, The Butts, Greenfields amenity land, Northanger play area, Windmill Hill, Barley Fields & play area and the newly refurbished Holybourne play area. As well as Flood Meadows and the newest addition to the Town Council portfolio - the lower field at Will Hall Meadow.

Ladv Place Car Park, Alton GU34 1EN. Alton's Public Gardens in the town centre is where many events are held in the summertime and musicians perform live from the bandstand.

The large lawns are ideal for picnics, beautiful formal flower beds and an interesting variety of wellestablished trees and a popular play area for young children (which includes a wheelchair accessible swing and roundabout.) With refreshments available to purchase from Acorns mobile café located just inside the main gates. Public Toilets are available in the adjacent car park.

Miss Bell's Fountain is a prominent historical feature in the garden, framed by a commemorative Parterre Rose Garden, Restoration works have seen the fountain in the gardens become a useable drinking fountain ideal for refilling water bottles on warm summers days. The fountain originally stood on the Assembly Rooms Lawn (where the Cairn is today.) It is one of a pair, with the other located on Butts Road opposite Borovere Lane.

The Public Gardens is also home to Alton Bowls Club and features an outdoor bowling green and clubhouse which has been leased to the Alton Bowling Club since 1954.







FLOOD MEADOWS AND WILL HALL MEADOW

The two areas are separated by New Odiham Road, with the river connecting Flood Meadows with Alton's newest open space and the northern source of the River Wey – Will Hall Meadow.

With fifteen acres of relaxing open space only 100 yards from the town centre, Flood Meadows is a great place for a lunchtime picnic or scenic stroll along the 'Wey Walk'. Featuring a combination of semi-wild conservation areas, open green areas, tree lined footpaths and a riverside walk next to the disused watercress beds.

Both sites are easily accessible with several footpath entrances into the sites, the closest pay and display car park being Bank Car Park, Vicarage Hill, Alton GU34 1HT.

KING'S POND

Ashdell Road, Alton GU34 2TA. King's Pond is a conservation area close to the town centre that supports a range of wildlife, birds, and wildflowers, please note fishing is not permitted. A lovely place to enjoy nature with a variety of waterfowl and birds to spot along the circular route around the water's edge. There are several benches along the route where you can stop to take in the views across the pond and picnic benches on the top lawn. There is a small free car park for visitors to the pond, but this can become full at busy times.

WINDMILL HILL

A large public open space comprising of approximately 25 acres, with mown footpaths through the long grass meadows and a copse of trees at the summit of the hill. The site is popular with dog walkers and local families alike, with natural carved wooden seats and logs ideal for a rest to take in the stunning panoramic views towards the Selborne Hanger and over the town. Windmill Hill is one of the 'Six Hills of Alton' which form part of a popular circular walk around Alton. Several footpaths enter the site, the most popular entrance being through the kissing gate located off Salisbury Close, Alton GU34 2TG.

ANSTEY PARK

Anstey Lane, Alton, GU34 2NB. Anstey Park spans some 32 acres of open space and is used for a variety of functions and events. Including the provision of rugby and football pitches, community courts used for a variety of sports including netball, tennis and basketball and a fitness trim trail.

Anstey Skate Park is a concrete skatepark made up of a large quarter-pipe ramp to ledge, hubba, roll-in ramp which is adjacent to a smaller quart ramp and a set of ledges located off to the side of the main area.

Other facilities include a children's play area, the Finnimore Pavilion and Energique Health Club & Spa which is also home to Sugarloaf Coffee House and Olivia Grayce Hair, beauty and wellness centre.

A variety of clubs are located within the park: Alton Football Club which features a full size 3G facility, Alton Rugby Club, the Royal British Legion, the Scouts, the Army and Air Cadets.

JUBILEE PLAYING FIELDS and ALTON SPORTS CENTRE

Chawton Park Road, Alton GU34 1ST. Jubilee Playing Fields is used primarily for football in the autumn and winter, then transformed for cricket during the spring and summer months.

Jubilee Skate Park is a concrete plaza style skatepark with a mini ramp to one side, built in February 2020. The plaza section features a back and forth between quarter pipes, with features including ledges, rails, banks, manual pags and 360 rollovers split over three levels across the park.

There are two sports pavilions located at each end of the Jubilee Playing Fields: The Harry Baker Pavilion and The Charles Read Pavilion. Several clubs are located nearby including Alton Cardiac Rehab, Alton Tennis Club, Chawton Park Indoor Bowls, and the Guides & Brownies headquarters.

Next to Jubilee Fields is Alton Sports Centre. The new £20 million state of the art centre replaced the previous facility with superb new facilities and a fantastic range of activities including: a hi-tech six-lane main pool, learner pool, large gym, group cycling studio, group fitness studios, a clip and climb wall, café, children's soft play, and the Chawton Park Spa. ACTIVE ALTON

ALTON EVENTS

Alton and the surrounding villages host a wide range of events with something for everyone.

Alton Town Council organise and support a variety of events in the town. Including one of the most diverse and longest Walking Festivals in the UK taking place over the entire month of May as well as an Autumn Walking Festival in October. Alton is a destination town for walkers, and the host for the 2022 annual 'Walkers are Welcome' national gathering.

The Town Council also offers a variety of themed markets in the Public Gardens over the summer and Christmas Markets in the Market Square supporting and showcasing local independent crafters, artists, charities, and community groups.

New for 2022 the Town Council is staging 'Live from the Bandstand' a series of brass band concerts on Sunday summer afternoons in the Public Gardens. Plus 'Live from the Square' where young local musicians are given the opportunity to showcase their talents as part of a series of free to attend concerts.

Alton is the hometown of Jane Austen, every June the town is transformed for Alton Regency Week. A literary festival celebrating the world-renowned female author who lived in the neighbouring village of Chawton.

The town is also well-known for its love of vintage and heritage transportation events. It is the home of the Mid-Hants Railways, Watercress Line heritage railway.

Which offers a variety of themed events from 'War on the line', 'Day out with Thomas' and even a record-breaking festive 'Illuminated Steam Train'.

In July Alton hosts one of Britain's biggest annual Bus Rallies & Running Days at Anstey Park, with a large display of Buses and Coaches of all shapes and sizes from a variety of eras.

The Alton Classic Car Show is held each September, when the whole town centre is filled with classic, vintage, American and military vehicles complimented by an eco-friendly electric vehicle display.

There are so many events held locally it is impossible to list them all here including village fetes, community picnics, music festivals, art exhibitions, charity fun runs and tribute nights.

Alton is very lucky to have its own community radio station where they feature local events, you can listen to Wey Valley Radio on 101.1 FM in Alton and the surrounding area, and online via www.weyvalleyradio.uk.







WALKS AND TRAILS IN ALTON

As the Gateway to the South Downs National Park, Alton offers superb walks and cycle routes across the Hampshire countryside.

Alton has a rich history with many interesting places to visit. With a wonderful selection of short circular walks taking you around the town and natural open spaces within the town as well as out towards the stunning parish boundary.

For those looking for more of a challenging walk along undulating paths and tracks, far reaching and unspoilt countryside views, Alton has a fantastic selection of longer walks. Why not try the Writers' Way (Chawton to Selborne), Alton Six Hills Walk, the Hangers Way, or to access the St Swithun's Way (Winchester to Farnham).

Alton is very lucky to have a wonderful group of volunteers called, Walk Alton, who bring together representatives from local walking groups and clubs alongside the Town Council and local businesses. Walk Alton aims to support and develop walking activities in the Alton area, both for recreation and to support local initiatives to improve people's health, and to work with the local community, businesses, walking-related organisations and local authorities. As well as being popular for walking, Alton is also an ideal location for cyclists. There is something for all abilities, from short rides into the town centre for a spot of local shopping or a bite to eat, or long distance cycle routes through picturesque 'chocolate box' villages or into the neighbouring South Downs National Park. For the more adventurous rider there are plenty of off-road tracks to explore in the surrounding countryside and woodland cycle paths.

Throughout the town you will find plenty of cycle storage and two maintenance stations which can be located on the Cycle Alton map. The map, along with suggested local cycle routes, a journey planner tool and information on local cycling clubs can be found on the 'My Journey Active Alton' website — www. myjourneyhampshire.com/cycle/ active-alton. QR codes have been added to the cycle infrastructure in the town centre which take you to the website, alternatively a printed Cycle Alton leaflet is also available.



The success of Alton's annual Walking and Cycling Festival in May, is indicative of how popular the area is with walkers and cyclists, whether they live locally or are visiting.



The Curtis Museum

The Curtis Museum in Alton is home to one of the finest local history collections in Hampshire, exploring 100 million years of the region's past. There's also a regular programme of events, complete with family-friendly and educational activities. Free admission.

FOOD AND DRINK

Whether you are looking for somewhere to enjoy drinks with friends, coffee with colleagues or dining with family, Alton has a variety of restaurants, cafes, pubs and take-aways to choose from.

Alton's piazza style Market
Square offers alfresco seating
where you can enjoy take-aways
or picnics. There are many pubs
and restaurants fronting the
Market Square including Pizza
Express, Mifta's Indian
restaurant, as well as the Market
Hotel and the Wheatsheaf where
most weekends you can find live
music and entertainment. Plus
the very popular Ten Tun Tap
House, an independent bar
focusing on amazing beer from
specialist breweries.

Alton is lucky to have several independent and well-known chain cafes in the town centre perfect for lunch, a morning coffee or afternoon tea treat. The High Street is home to the traditional Italian coffee shop Bottega Dei Sapori, Beans and Bakes sandwich bar, Stones cafe, Costa and Café Nero.

Just off the High Street are Austen's café on Lenten Street, Blend-it the healthy food and juice bar in Westbrook Walk, Coffee Cherry on Normandy Street, and the Alton Hideout café on Turk Street.



If you are dining out there are several restaurants offering a range of cuisine in the town centre including the new Heavens Kitchen steak house, Thai restaurants the River Kwai and the Thai Boutique, Frango's Grill barbecue restaurant, Oceans 11 fish and chip bar, and Indian restaurants the Curry Palace and the Balti Tandoori.

For those preferring take-away, there is a wide selection on offer including Chinese, Indian, Thai, pizza, fish & chips, burgers and kebabs. Alton is now served by Deliveroo with many local restaurants now also available for take-away food using the service.

Due to Alton's brewing heritage, it is still home to 12 pubs in the town vicinity some of which also offer delicious traditional pub food. 
